

MUTUAL RESPECT FOR ALL ANTEATERS

At UCI Transportation & Distribution Services, we believe mutual respect is essential for creating a safe environment for everyone. Whether walking, biking, or driving, please use designated pathways and obey all signage. When riding your bike or scooter, always travel on the right side of the road with traffic, wear your helmet, and use lights for added safety. <u>Skateboards, skate devices, and electric scooters</u> may be ridden to campus; however, once you have entered campus core, these devices must be walked or secured to a <u>designated bike rack or skateboard locking hub.</u>

As a reminder, Ring Mall is a <u>Dismount Zone</u> from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, where all Anteaters are required to walk their devices to keep pedestrian traffic flowing smoothly and safely. Together, we share the responsibility for maintaining a safe and respectful campus.

UCI Transportation collaborates with regional transit authorities to advocate for efficient transit routes and cost-effective commuting options. In the coming months, we will be sharing additional resources from the City of Irvine, <u>Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA)</u>, and <u>Metrolink</u> to better connect our campus with local transportation centers and destinations. Our team implements environmentally responsible initiatives that reduce vehicle emissions and comply with regulations like <u>SCAQMD Rule 2202</u> and the <u>UCOP Sustainable</u> <u>Practices Policy</u>, all while operating as an auxiliary that does






not receive tuition fees or state funding. This commitment strengthens our partnerships with transit and vanpool services, enhancing commuting options available to our students, faculty, and staff.

Connectivity Starts with OC Bus

Our campus boasts one of the best bus connections in Orange County, featuring <u>five OC Bus routes</u> - 59, 79, 167, 178, and 473, that stop at UCI and link to cities including Placentia, Anaheim, Villa Park, Orange, Tustin, Newport Beach, Costa Mesa, and Huntington Beach. These buses are designed with practicality and accessibility in mind and include features such as wheelchair ramps and bike mounts. With UCI's <u>University Pass Membership</u>, available at an 82% discount from the regular monthly bus fair and for just \$169, faculty, staff, and students can enjoy unlimited rides on these routes through June 30, 2025. Metrolink FREE Student Pass & New Routes

Metrolink's popular <u>Student Adventure Pass</u> is now extended through June 30, 2025, allowing students to explore Southern California or commute to campus for free. To access your pass, simply download the <u>Metrolink mobile app</u>, create an account with your UCI email, activate the pass, and have your UCI Student ID when boarding.

Even better news, beginning October 21, Metrolink is adding nearly <u>a dozen new train routes</u> for the Tustin Station—the closest train station to UCI. To align with the new Metrolink schedules, UCI's dedicated Stationlink, <u>OC Bus route 473</u>, will be updated to offer more frequent services between campus and the Tustin Train Station.

OC Vanpool Savings for UCI Affiliates

Vanpooling is a reliable and sustainable travel solution for UCI affiliates who share similar commuting patterns. Popular UCI vanpools start in cities like Riverside, San Bernardino, Long Beach, Anaheim, Santa Ana, and Fullerton.

To make this commuting option more affordable, OCTA has recently <u>doubled its vanpool subsidies</u> to \$600-\$800 per month. This subsidy helps cover costs such as vehicle leasing, maintenance, and fuel, making it easier and more cost-effective for you to join a vanpool. Over the summer, T&DS dedicated efforts to improving campus infrastructure to enhance safety and the overall experience for everyone traveling on campus. These improvements included refurbishing <u>campus bike repair stands</u> with new tools and air pumps for optimal functionality, and maintenance work was completed in several staff and student <u>parking lots and</u> <u>shared-use pathways</u>. As you travel the campus, you may notice that several parking lots and roadways have been repainted and resurfaced, and efforts were made to address tree root intrusion issues on the Engineering Service Bike Path, further improving safety and visibility.


