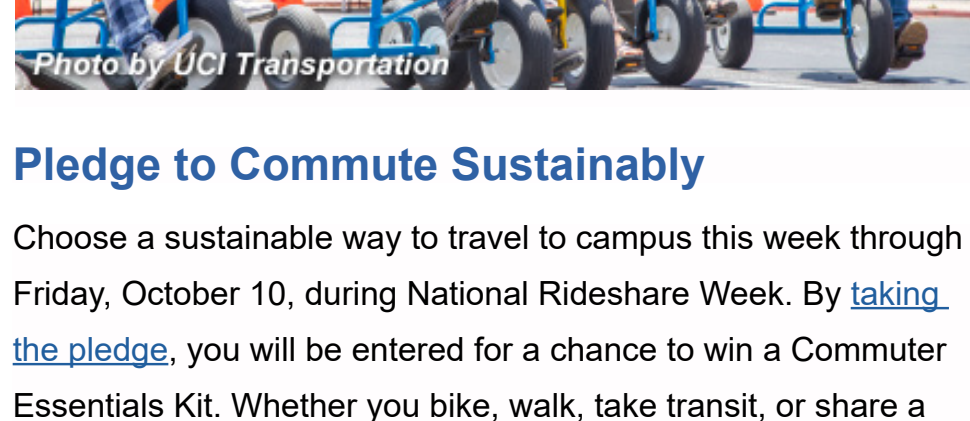

TRAVELING ON CAMPUS

Sharing the Road Safely with Others

Show mutual respect for others by following on-campus [riding rules](#) for bicycles, non-motorized scooters, and pedal-assist e-bikes. Riders must:

- Stay in designated bike lanes
- Follow the 8 MPH campus speed limit
- Dismount on [Ring Mall](#) from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Prohibited devices, including e-scooters, skateboards, and similar devices, must be walked on campus at all times. By following these laws and policies, we can maintain a respectful and safe environment for the entire UCI community.

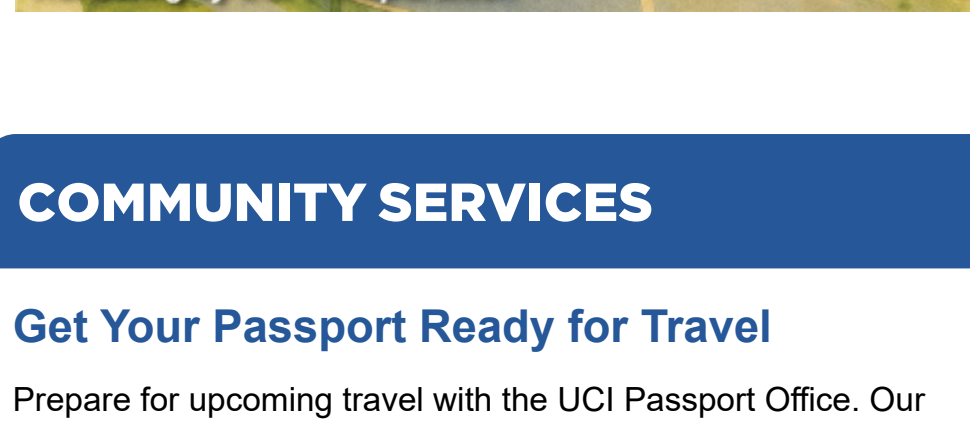
Tips for Your Campus Commute

Safe travel on campus starts with planning ahead. If driving, secure your permit early. Allow extra time for your commute and follow posted signage, whether you drive, bike, or walk. UCI Transportation will notify you of construction activity and events that significantly impact roadway conditions. 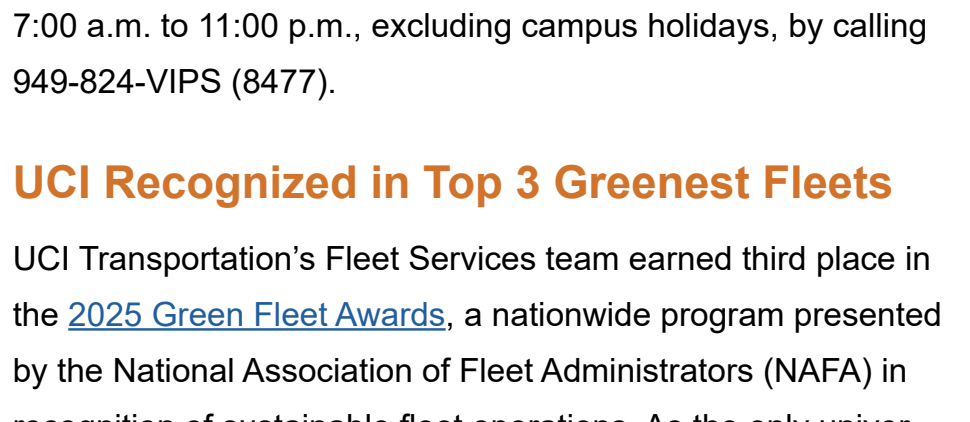
COMMUNITY SERVICES
